


Smart casual attire is appropriate for the conference sessions and welcome drinks and canapés. A jacket may be required for the air conditioned conference sessions.





As an Associate Editor and an editorial board member, he has

worked on a number of leading international transport journals and has authored or co-authored more than 100 peer-reviewed journal articles and conference proceedings. Prior to joining QUT, he has worked with a variety of industry partners including the American Automobile Association, RACQ, Departments of Transport.
